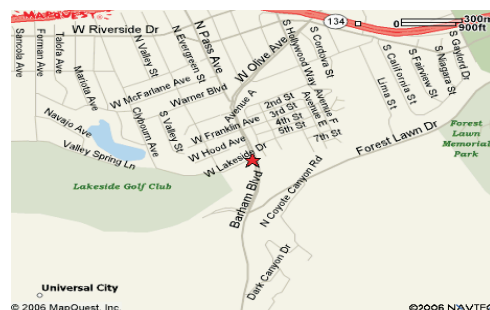

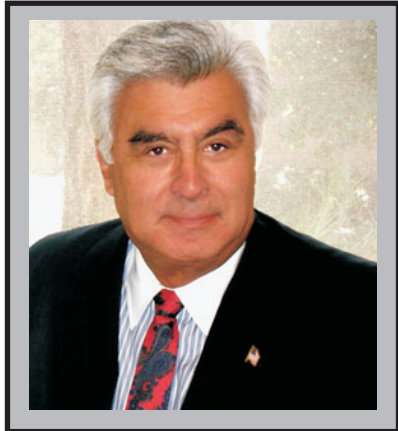


How Republicans Can Win in 2012

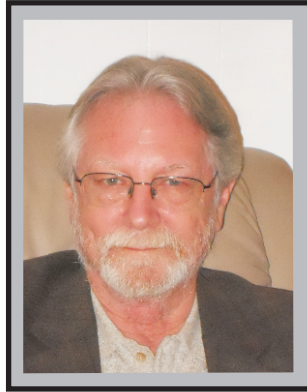
He is a frequent speaker at Republican clubs and organizations.

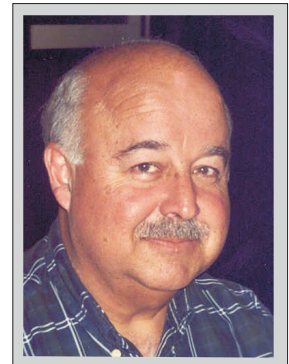

Forum Highlights, a report by Michael Lerew

March was a month full of big news events, and we had a good discussion of them at the Forum. The American position on Libya, and whether to get involved in the rebellion there, was one of the topics. **Brad Smith** thought we shouldn't get involved. **Eldon Quick** felt U.S. involvement should have been covert. Jane made the points that we have a President who has no guts, and that ultimately we are human beings, when it comes to whether to respond to innocent people who face a murderous dictator. **Brad** responded, look at Afghanistan. **Ron Scibilia** commented that the best Libyans will go to Italy and learn skills. Since our meeting, events have continued to move rapidly, as have the cruise missiles which the U.S. did end up firing at Libyan military targets.

In connection with the issue above, a vote was taken on the question: On foreign policy, is President Obama strong and competent, or weak and incompetent? The show of hands was unanimous for the latter option.

Ron S. suggested the question of whether it was better to attack Obama's policies, or go after what lies behind his policies? Lydia said it is a losing battle to attack him personally. **Josh** agreed, saying go after his policies. **Jane Barnett** said that the Republican Party needs to step up and explain that what's happening in America is the fault of liberal policies. **Ron S.** observed that Obama's popularity is attributable to the media, that won't delve into him.

The turmoil in Wisconsin over Governor Scott Walker's bill affecting public employee unions was a major topic at our meeting. The question was posed, what does all this, including the bizarre truancy of state Democrat senators, show us about the relationship between public employee unions and elected Democrats? **Brad** said it showed these officials have no alliance with the electorate. **Marilyn Bush** remarked that the Democrat senators showed they don't think they can get elected without the public employee unions. **Tom Hanson** commented that the unions have been choosing who will run as a Democrat. We need to pick our own good candidates. **Marilyn** noted that we need to address voter apathy, and she commented on the extremely low turnout at the last local Los Angeles election.

The group discussed the shocking announcement by a city of L.A. official, that pension costs now consume 18% of the city budget, but in just three years, they will double to 36% of the annual budget! **Brad** expressed the hope that maybe we can get a mayor who will be like Wisconsin's Scott Walker. **Tom** said that if Republicans don't turn out, we can't win. **Ron S.** said he put his money on bankruptcy. (And what prudent person would take the other side of that bet!).

We spent a lot of time on Wisconsin, because it is clearly so important on many levels. It was asked, what do you think is most significant about what has been going on there, and about the governor's reform bill finally passing? **Eldon** said this is a declaration of war by unions against the people. **Jane** said the most important thing is PR. People will understand the issues now. **Tom** commented that this should have happened a long time ago. **Julie Parr** observed that the public unions are controlled by the union bosses. **Marilyn** expressed admiration for Scott Walker for his courage and integrity. **Allan Brandstater** commented that this is epochal. **Genevieve Clavreul** remarked that unions have lost a lot of power in the last few years. **Eldon** felt that there's a lot of room to chip away at union loyalty. **Ron** said that our movement is going to bubble up from the states. **Tom** said that in the past, union members had no place to turn if they opposed the union.

We also touched on a subject that everyone who lives here will have noticed, which is the rising gas prices! Will the public hold Obama responsible for high gas prices, despite the media's protection of him? **Brad** thought it possible, but highly unlikely. **Tom** noted that we have to refine oil into gasoline, and that will be the next battle. The public should be aware how much of that \$4.00 per gallon price is taxes. **Josh** said that Obama is blaming the world's oil companies, and **Eldon** pointed out that oil is a world market. **Lydia Gutierrez** predicted that Democrats will blame the corporations for the gas prices. **Ron** thought that Obama would be held responsible for the economy. **Bill Saracino** pointed out that in Obama's recent news conference, he said he wished the increase in gas prices had been slower. (Implying the increase was OK with him, of course).

It was an interesting discussion, and as always, it was refreshingly free of stifling political correctness.

Our Speaker last month was then Candidate for CA Republican Party Chair, Tom Del Beccaro. He has since then been elected to that office. His presentation to SCRW&M at that luncheon was, in a way, a rehearsal for his acceptance speech at the Party Convention. The Way Forward for CA Republicans

Good morning Delegates.

There are no Teleprompters here – so I will speak from the heart and tell you what I truly believe . . . and what I truly want to do is to welcome you to a new day in California Politics.

Before we talk about that future, and our new day, one more time, it is worthy to note that across the country last November, voters spoke out against runaway government. So loudly did they speak that they recalled the Democrat Congress and put in a new Republican Congress.

As we know the tide of Republican electoral victories did not reach California. Some said that that was evidence that the Republican Party in was irrelevant in California. Other Republicans said even worse.

I stand before you to say that: They Are Wrong.

Rather than surrender to those who only can say no, California Republicans should all remember that voters in California last November once again approved our ideas. They approved our ideas by once again rejecting tax increases, by making it harder to raise taxes disguised as something called fees, and by supporting electoral reform.

So while our candidates did not fare as well as we would like, this much I do know:

Republican ideas are alive and well in California.

As many of you know, I wrote a three part series called The Way Forward.

In part one of the series, I discussed the difficulties we face. In my judgment we face three major hurdles.

First, we simply do not communicate with enough California voters. We have trapped ourselves into talking to the already converted instead of inspiring a new set of voters. We have become more comfortable with an email list than with Independent voters, or minority voters, or with the next generation.

In other words we have become the party of limited communication.

Beyond that first problem of talking to a subset of voters and somehow believing we can persuade a majority of voters, California Republicans lack a focused message.

In a world dominated by the background noise of a 24 hour news cycle more than ever, we need a focused message on the issues meaningful to California voters.

Third, Republicans everywhere must come to understand that while we are right to believe in limited government, our strategy of limited campaigning is no longer viable. We must come to understand that the American Left and their Democrat party, dominated by unions, evangelizes, politics and build constituencies every day, of every year - not just at the end of campaign cycle.

We must realize that those programs that they fund, redundant though they may be, are not just programs but also coalition building exercises funded by the American taxpayer.

On the other hand, Republicans, by in large, wait until the end of a cycle and attempt to persuade a limited number of voters. It should be obvious who is winning that battle: Democrats. They are winning because they are in the market place of ideas every day of every year.

All together, we should wonder little why there are over 2 million more Democrats than Republicans in California.

So where does this leave us and what are we to do?

Three Decades ago we got some advice from someone who cared about us very much. Faced with a country rife with political malaise, Ronald Reagan told us this:

It is time for us to realize that we are too great a nation to limit ourselves to small dreams. We're not, as

some would have us believe, doomed to an inevitable decline. I do not believe in a fate that will fall on us no matter what we do. I do believe in a fate that will fall on us if we do nothing.

I stand before you today to say:

It is time for us to realize that we are too great a Party to limit ourselves to small dreams. The CA Republican Party, as some would have us believe, is not doomed to an inevitable decline. And I certainly do not believe in a fate that will fall on us no matter what we do. I do believe in a fate that will fall on us if we do nothing.

Let us continue to take Reagan's advice, and with all the creative energy at our command, let us begin an era of California Republican Party renewal. Let us renew our determination, our courage, and our strength. And let us renew our faith and our hope. We have every right to dream heroic dreams.

So what does this renewal look like?

First, we need to consistently, not just here in Sacramento, but around this state communicate with people where they live and in terms they understand.

Second, we need a focused message that is concentrated on the issues facing Californians that will help them in their everyday lives.

Third, we need to start communicating at the start of a cycle and not just at the end of a cycle, and, once again we need to follow Reagan's advice and not limit our appeal to those already converted.

We must carry our message to every Californian, regardless of party affiliation, who is a member of this community of shared values.

To do that, today I am announcing the California Republican Party Speak Tour.

We will be traveling the state, holding Town Halls, highlighting our views where people live and in terms they understand, in places like Fresno, Los Angeles, Monterey and more. As part of that we will be utilizing local talk show hosts, internet messaging and grass roots organizing. We will invite Republicans, Independents and like-minded Democrats to participate. As part of this process I am pleased to announce three new websites which will help us in this endeavor.

#1 – CA GOP CARES which will highlight our charitable efforts. As the party of volunteerism, we must bring that message to all of California.

#2- WHERE ARE THE JOBS JERRY. Every two weeks, around this state we will be highlighting to California the contrasts between Jerry Brown's job promises and our unemployment rate.

#3- COST OF GOVERNMENT. With this site, we will be highlighting how much government waste costs Californians in terms meaningful to their lives such as how many teachers we could have had but for each wasteful program.

The goal of these programs is to change the political environment in California.

Across America Democrat & Republican governors in places like New York and New Jersey, no less blue than California, have responded to the call to reform Government in reasonable ways and with an eye to the future.
